Aspen's school meals

Please see the flyer regarding the increase in price for school meals from September.

Over half a million additional pupils will become eligible for Free School Meals under the new eligibility criteria. The change means that all households receiving <u>Universal Credit</u>, above the current £7,400 income cap, will qualify for this support. The new eligibility will take effect in **September 2026**. Families receiving Universal Credit will be able to access free school meals starting from the 2026/27 school year.
