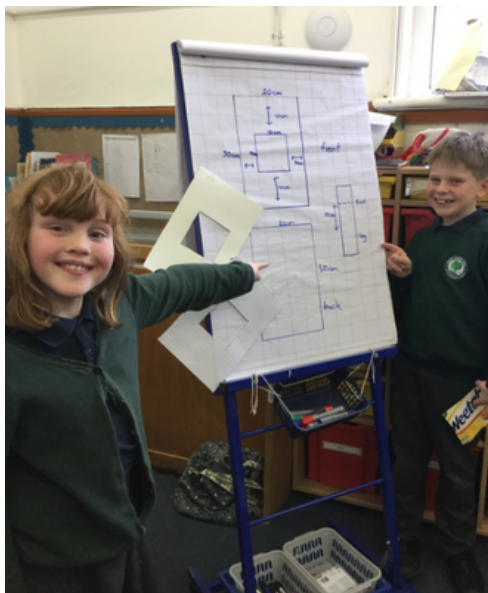
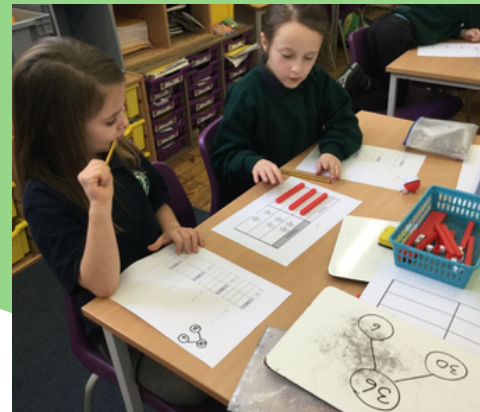
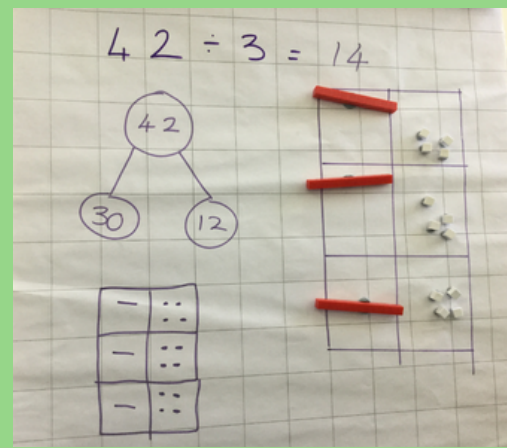
Open the Book this week was held at the Church where members of the local Church community covered our school value, Dignity. The children were involved in acting out a bible story about treating others with dignity and respect.



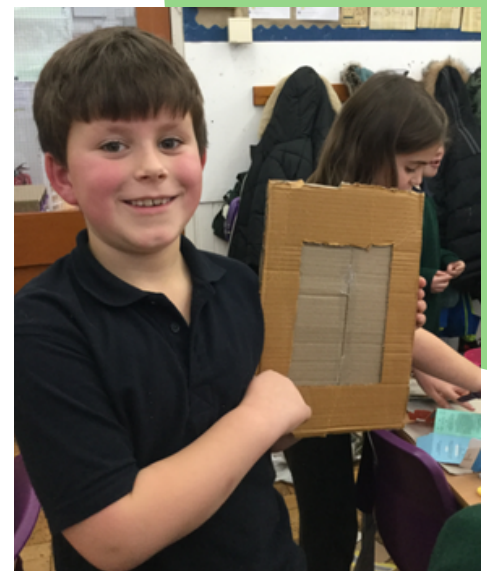
Messy Church carried on with the same theme 'Dignity' and the children got stuck into a range of craft activities. Marnie from Year 4 said "I enjoy Messy Church because you get to do different activities like quizzes".



This week in Squirrels' History lessons, the children have been learning about the Egyptians looking at how different the rich and poor lived. The children created a playscript using the information they have learned covering different lifestyles. In English, the class have been learning fronted adverbials and dialogue and creating pieces of writing based on the book 'Black Dog' by Levi Pinfold about overcoming fears. The children wrote their own versions of the story. During Maths, the class have been covering multiplication with two and three digit numbers and division of two digit numbers.



A bit of Bob Marley was enjoyed during their music lesson which was studying pulse and during Design and Technology (DT), the children have been looking at structure and stability using picture frames. This involved the children planning their own designs and making them. Henry said 'it was fun and creative. I enjoyed measuring and cutting out the cardboard'.
